Pursuant to your request, the following is a listing of environmental programs that have been developed or under consideration at this time.

BLLENHEIM-GILBOA

- Fish Stocking Program
- Mallet Pond
- General Landscaping
- Mine Kill State Park
- BG Upper Reservoir - Public access for boating and fishing - 4 constant level ponds - enhance reproduction within this fishery
- Transmission Line Landscaping
 - Common Corridor on BG Project for Gilboa-Leeds and Gilboa-New Scotland lines, trees are only topped to maintain visual integrity
 - Single pole (corten) structures are on BG site in order to blend with environment
 - Planting programs on 3 transmission lines right-of-ways.
- White cedar tree plantings
- Eagle siting and management program
- Joint hiking and cross-country ski trails between Visitors' Center and Mine Kill State Park
- Hunting opportunities along Route 30 between Mine Kill and Visitors' Center
- Blue Bird Trails (3 miles)
- Visitors' Center Pond - conservation and education programs
- Speakers' Bureau
- Fossils


